

People Arrived on Aegean islands



In 2021, people arriving is down 61.5%, compared to 2020. In November 32 boats was officially registered as arrived on the Greek islands, carrying a total of 519 people. Arrivals has decreased 34.9% compared to October, boats arriving is up 28%. Demographics on the islands: Men 59%, Women 13% and Children 28%

Total arrivals has increased 47.9% compared to same month in 2020. 161 boats started their trip towards the Greek islands in November, carrying a total of 4181 people. 32 boats made the trip, carrying a total of 519 people, the rest, 129 boats, 3662 people, were picked up by the Turkish Coast guard, most of these boats had been pushed back by the Greek Coast Guard.

Total numbers so far this year



In 2021 798 boats have been stopped on their way towards Greece, 23.313 people have been arrested. Boats arriving on the Greek island has been reduced due to the Greek governments pushback tactics, boats picked up by TCG has increased for the same reason. Also the COVID-19 pandemic have had a huge impact. Population on the islands is 3795.






Arrivals and transfers by island

In November 1051 people were transported to mainland, from the Greek islands. Transfers have increased 41.1% compared to October, when 745 people were transported. In the last 12 months population on the Aegean islands has decreased by 78.2%, from 17.424 to 3795 people. The Greek government have drastically reduced population on the Greek island, due to illegal pushbacks performed by the Greek authorities in the Aegean Sea.



Arrivals




Transfers

Population on each island



Official capacity on the islands is 13.811 people. Today's population is 10.000 people under max total capacity. In the end of November 2020 total population was 17.424, one year later its 3795, population has decreased by 13.629 people in 12 months on the Greek Islands, living conditions in the camps remains the same, or even worse, inhuman.




It is the legal right of men, women or children to enter a country with or without paperwork, if they intend to apply for asylum. Pushbacks are the illegal practice of a state preventing them from doing so by stopping them entering its territory, or forcing them back across a border or into the waters of another state. The Greek government has hugely increased illegal pushbacks of refugees since March 2020, with some victims stating they have been beaten and robbed by Greek officials before being forced back across borders, or into the sea.

Total people 2021: 14.472




Total pushbacks 2021: 572

In November Aegean Boat Report have registered 107 pushback cases in the Aegean Sea, involving 2835 children, women and men who tried to reach safety in Europe. Many of them had already arrived on the Greek Aegean islands, arrested by police, forced back to sea and left drifting in life rafts, illegally deported by the Hellenic Coast Guard (HCG), on orders from the Greek government, so far there has been no reaction from the EU on these illegal atrocities.

Of 107 registered pushback cases in November, 33 of these cases was performed by using rescue equipment/life rafts, 847 people, children, women and men was placed in a total of 48 life rafts, and left helplessly drifting at sea by the Hellenic Coast Guard, a systematic use of rescue equipment as a deportation tool. The Turkish coast guard and police picked up 3688 people floating in the Aegean Sea and on Turkish beaches, in 130 cases in November, 82.3% of these cases people had been pushed back by the Hellenic coast guard.
