
## MONTHLY STATISTICS JANUARY 2023

### People Registered on Aegean islands




In 2023, people arriving is up 388.3%, compared to 2022. In January 52 boats was officially registered as arrived on the Greek islands, carrying a total of 1.372 people. Arrivals has decreased 22.1% compared to December, boats arriving is down 24.6%. Demographics on the islands: Men 52%, Women 24% and Children 24%

Total arrivals has increased 388.3% compared to same month in 2022. 165 boats started their trip towards the Greek islands in January, carrying a total of 4.478 people. 52 boats made the trip, carrying a total of 1.372 people, the rest, 113 boats, 3.106 people, were picked up by the Turkish Coast guard, 55% of these boats had been pushed back by the Greek Coast Guard.

### Total numbers so far this year



In 2023 113 boats have been stopped on their way towards Greece, 3.106 people have been arrested. Boats arriving on the Greek island has been reduced due to the Greek governments pushback tactics, boats picked up by TCG has increased for the same reason. Also the COVID-19 pandemic have had a huge impact. Population on the islands is 4.819.






### Arrivals and transfers by island

In January 788 people were transported to mainland, from the Greek islands. Transfers have decreased 28.8% compared to December, when 1.107 people were transported. In the last 12 months population on the Aegean islands has increased by 43.7%, from 3.354 to 4.819 people. The Greek government have drastically reduced population on the Greek island, due to illegal pushbacks performed by the Greek authorities in the Aegean Sea.



#### Arrivals




#### Transfers

### Population on each island



Official capacity on the islands is 16.230 people. Today's population is 11.411 people under max total capacity. In the end of January 2022 total population was 3.354, one year later its 4.819, population has increased by 1.465 people in 12 months on the Greek Islands. In the last 12 months 26.803 people have been pushed back by Greek authorities.




It is the legal right of men, women or children to enter a country with or without paperwork, if they intend to apply for asylum. Pushbacks are the illegal practice of a state preventing them from doing so by stopping them entering its territory, or forcing them back across a border or into the waters of another state. The Greek government has hugely increased illegal pushbacks of refugees since March 2020, with some victims stating they have been beaten and robbed by Greek officials before being forced back across borders, or into the sea.

**Total people 2023: 1.881**




**Total pushbacks 2023: 66**

In January Aegean Boat Report have registered 66 pushback cases in the Aegean Sea, involving 1.881 children, women and men who tried to reach safety in Europe. Many of them had already arrived on the Greek Aegean islands, arrested by police, forced back to sea and left drifting in life rafts, illegally deported by the Hellenic Coast Guard (HCG), on orders from the Greek government, so far there has been no reaction from the EU on these illegal atrocities.

Of 66 registered pushback cases in January, 25 of these cases was performed by using rescue equipment/life rafts, 583 people, children, women and men was placed in a total of 36 life rafts, and left helplessly drifting at sea by the Hellenic Coast Guard, a systematic use of rescue equipment as a deportation tool. The Turkish coast guard and police picked up 3.127 people floating in the Aegean Sea and on Turkish beaches, in 115 cases in January, 57.4% of these cases people had been pushed back by the Hellenic coast guard.
