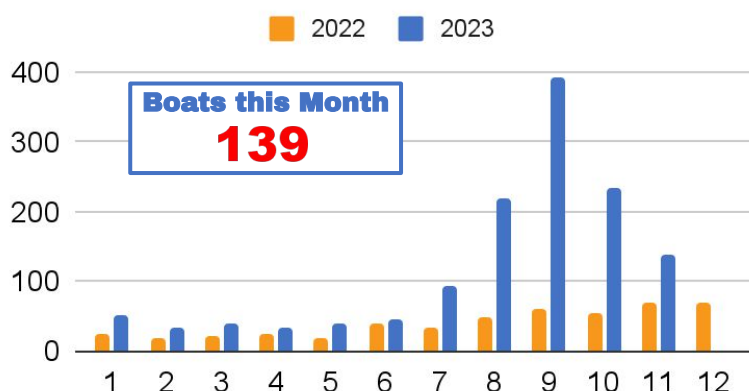

People Registered on Aegean islands

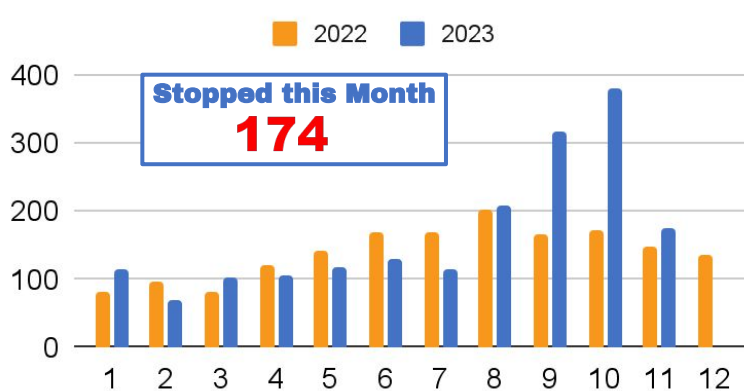


In 2023, people arriving is up 255%, compared to 2022. In November 139 boats was officially registered as arrived on the Greek islands, carrying a total of 4.071 people. Arrivals has decreased 36.6% compared to October, boats arriving is down 40.3%. Demographics on the islands: Men 52%, Women 24% and Children 24%

Boats Officially Arrived

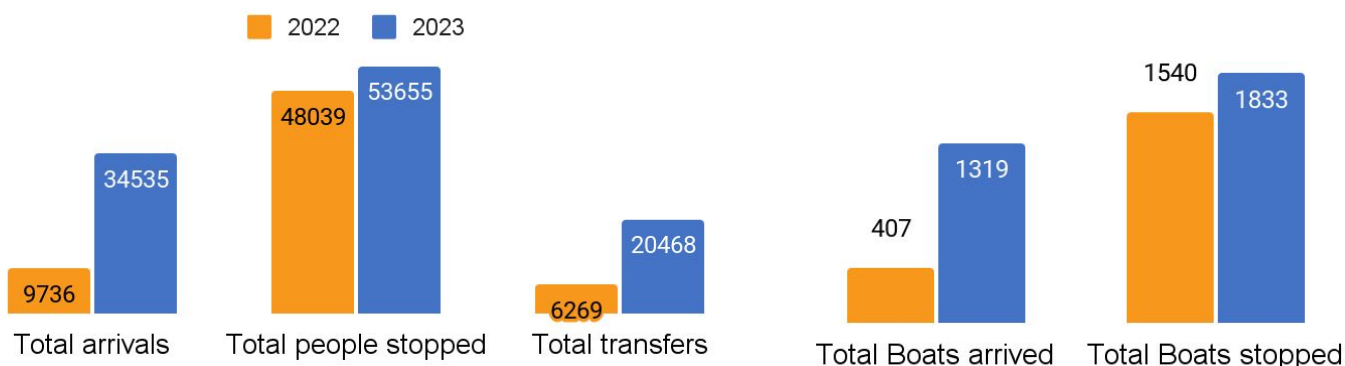


Boats Stopped/Rescued by TCG



Arrivals has increased 117% compared to the same month in 2022. 313 boats started their trip towards the Greek islands in November, carrying a total of 9.112 people. 139 boats made the trip, carrying a total of 4.071 people, the rest, 174 boats, 5.041 people, were picked up by the Turkish Coast guard, 40.9% of these people had been pushed back by the Greek Coast Guard.

Total numbers so far this year



In 2023 1.833 boats have been stopped on their way towards Greece, 53.655 people have been arrested. Boats arriving on the Greek island has been reduced due to the Greek governments pushback tactics, on Greek islands and at sea, boats picked up by TCG has increased for the same reason. Population on the islands is 16.056 people.

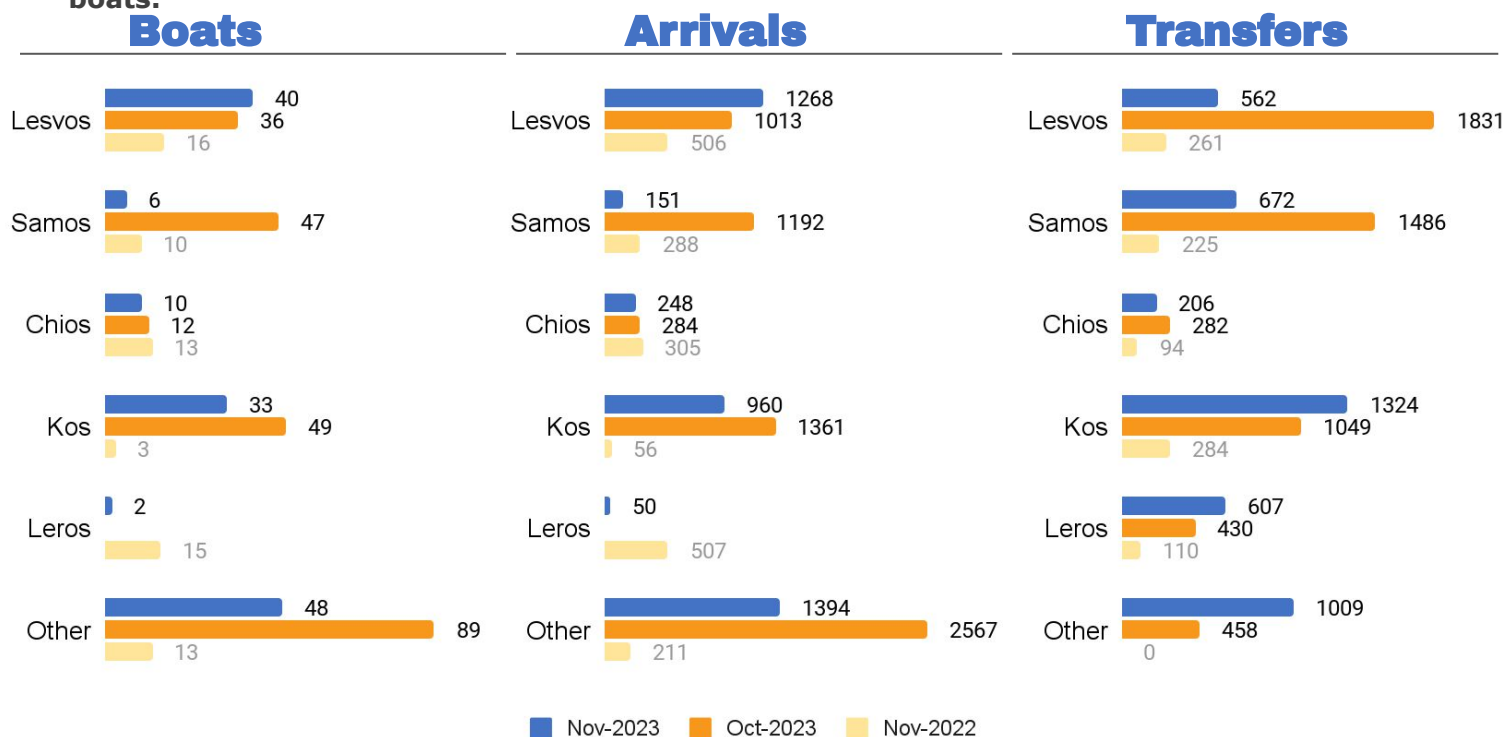

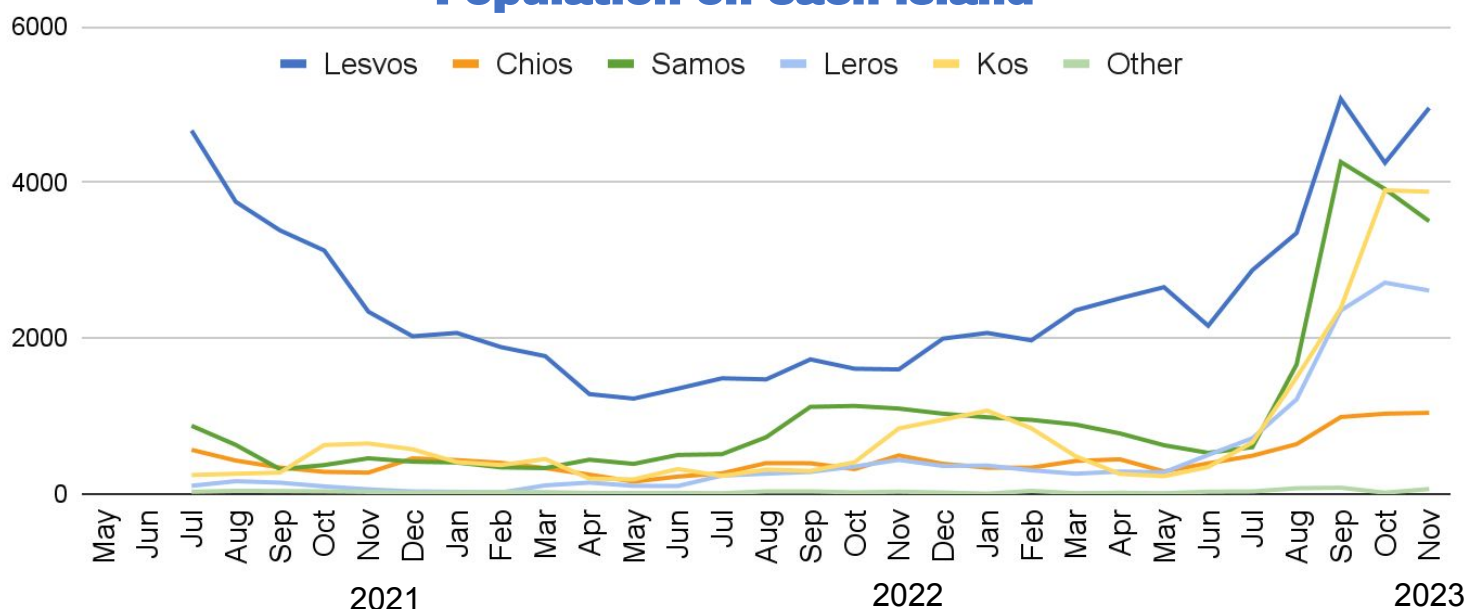

Arrivals and transfers by island

In November 4.380 people were transported to mainland, from the Greek islands. Transfers have decreased 20.9% compared to October, when 5.536 people were transported. In the last 12 months population on the Aegean islands has increased by 258%, from 4.488 to 16.056 people. The Greek government are trying to reduce arrivals on the Greek islands by illegally pushing back people crossing from Turkey towards the islands in small rubber boats.



Population on each island



Official capacity on the islands is 18.755 people. Today's population is 2.699 people under max total capacity. In the end of November 2022 total population was 4.488, one year later its 16.056, population has increased by 11.568 people in 12 months on the Greek Islands. In the last 12 months 26.055 people have been pushed back by Greek authorities.

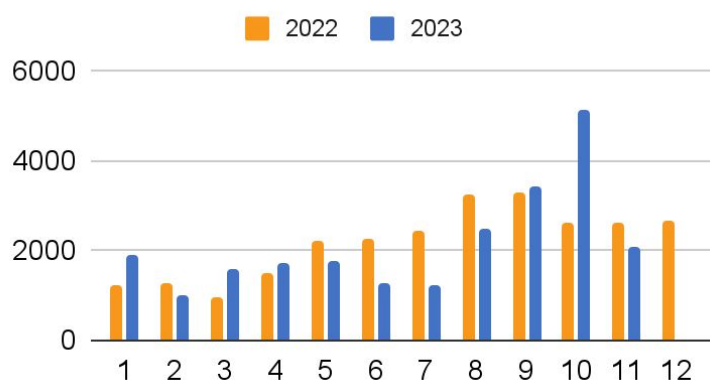

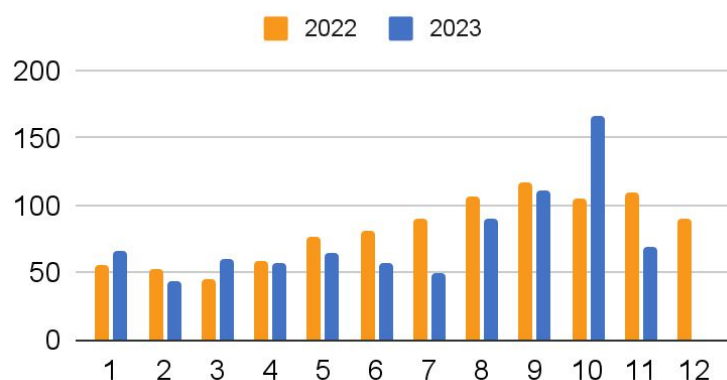
It is the legal right of men, women or children to enter a country with or without paperwork, if they intend to apply for asylum. Pushbacks are the illegal practice of a state preventing them from doing so by stopping them entering its territory, or forcing them back across a border or into the waters of another state. The Greek government has hugely increased illegal pushbacks of refugees since March 2020, with some victims stating they have been beaten and robbed by Greek officials before being forced back across borders, or into the sea.

Total people 2023: **23.412**

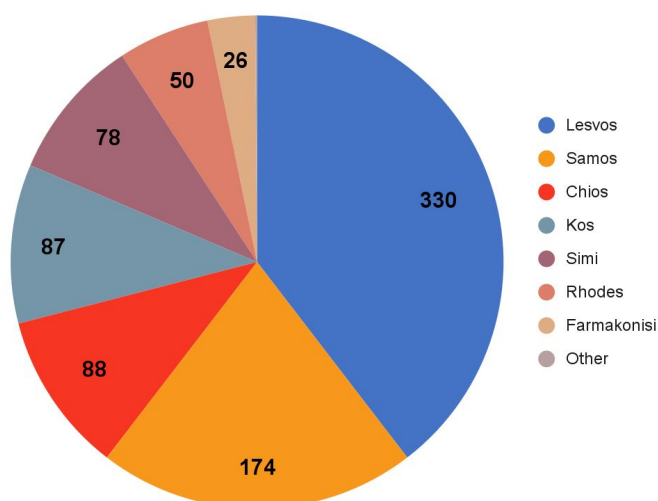

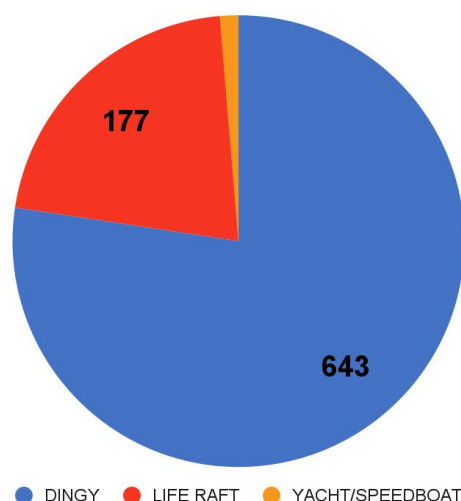
Total pushbacks 2023: **835**

In November Aegean Boat Report have registered 70 pushback cases in the Aegean Sea, involving 2.064 children, women and men who tried to reach safety in Europe. Some of them had already arrived on the Greek Aegean islands, arrested by police, forced back to sea and left drifting in life rafts, illegally deported by the Hellenic Coast Guard (HCG), on orders from the Greek government, so far there has been no reaction from the EU on these illegal atrocities.

Of 70 registered pushback cases in November, 15 of these cases was performed by using rescue equipment/life rafts, 389 people, children, women and men was placed in 20 life raft, and left helplessly drifting at sea by the Hellenic Coast Guard, a systematic use of rescue equipment as a deportation tool. The Turkish coast guard and police picked up 5.041 people floating in the Aegean Sea and on Turkish beaches in 174 cases in November, 40.2% of these cases people had been pushed back by the Hellenic coast guard.
