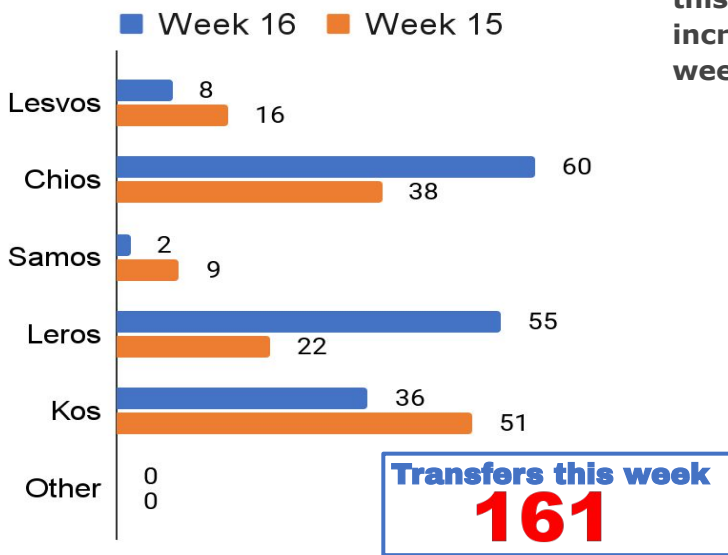

Boats Stopped TCG/Police

14 BOATS
274 PEOPLE

A total of 20 boats started their journey towards the Greek Aegean Islands, carrying 493 people. Of these, 14 boats were stopped/pushed back, while 219 people were registered on the Greek islands. So far this year, 155 boats carrying 3,821 people have been picked up by the Turkish Coast Guard and police. In the same period, 2,605 people have been registered as arriving on the Greek islands on 86 boats. These numbers should have been significantly higher if not for pushbacks carried out by the Hellenic Coast Guard.

Transfers to Mainland

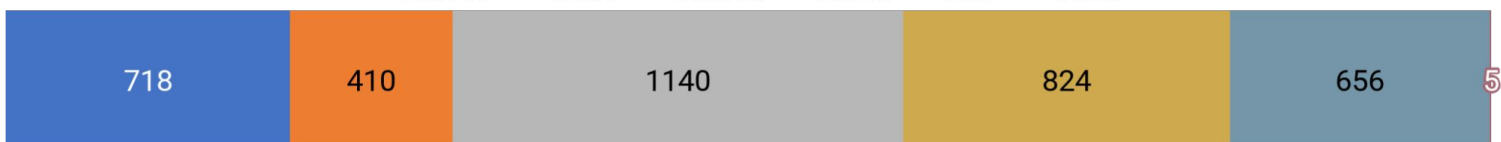


Transfers to mainland have increased 18.4% compared to last week, official population on the islands is 3,753 people. In the last 30 days population on the islands has decreased by 1,004 people. This decrease is largely driven by continued transfers to the mainland.

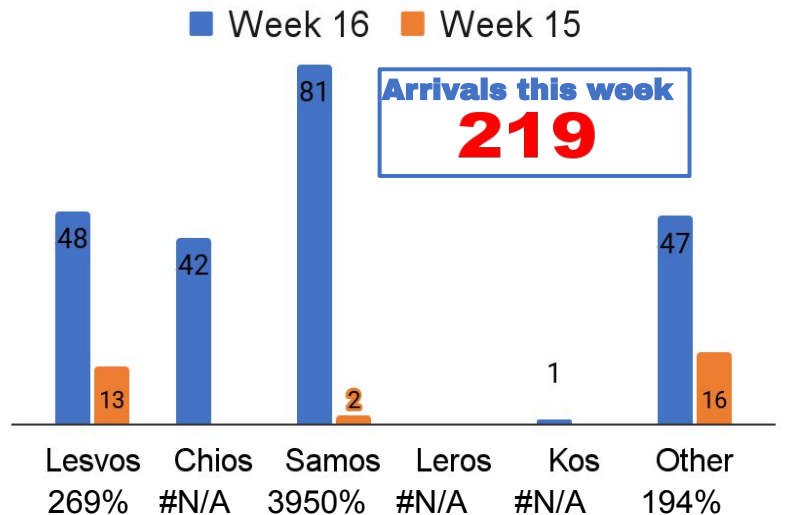
Without sustained relocations, population levels are likely to rise again as arrivals continue. Transfers remain the only effective measure to reduce pressure on the islands.

■ Lesvos ■ Chios ■ Samos ■ Leros ■ Kos ■ Other

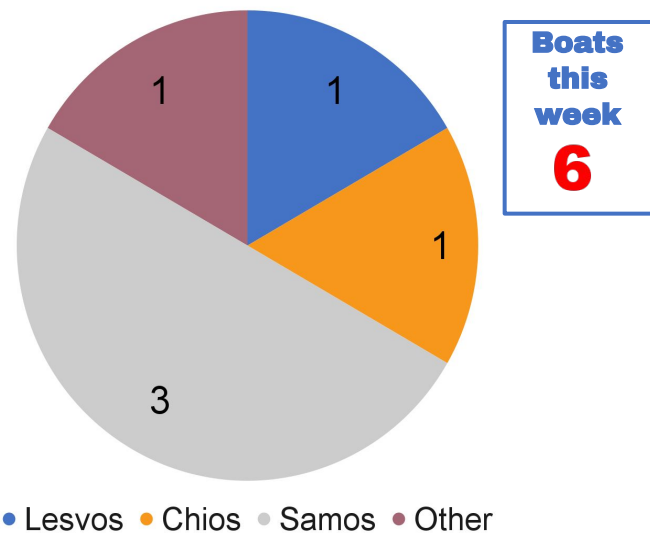


People Arrived on Aegean islands



Arrivals have increased by 606.5% compared to last week. The number of registered boats arriving on the islands is up from 2 boats last week to 6 boats this week. The total number of boats departing has increased from 8 boats last week to 20 boats this week.

Boats Arrived on islands



This week, TCG/police picked up 14 boats (70%), while 6 boats (30%) reached the Greek islands. So far this year, 86 boats have arrived, while 64.3% have been intercepted by TCG.
