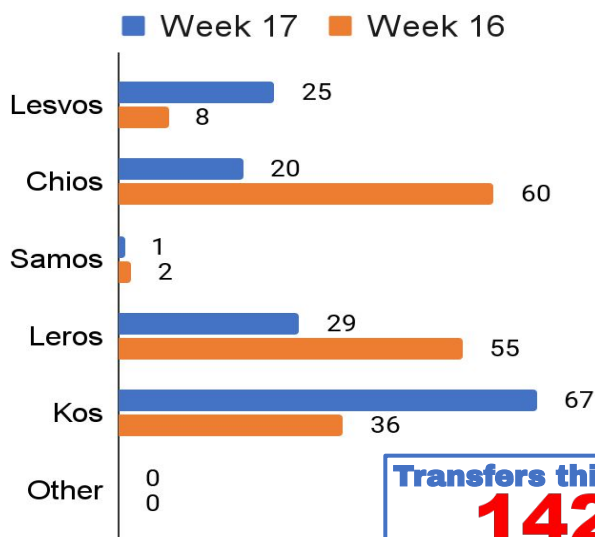

Boats Stopped TCG/Police

5 BOATS
152 PEOPLE

A total of 9 boats started their journey towards the Greek Aegean Islands, carrying 229 people. Of these, 5 boats were stopped/pushed back, while 77 people were registered on the Greek islands. So far this year, 160 boats carrying 3,973 people have been picked up by the Turkish Coast Guard and police. In the same period, 2,682 people have been registered as arriving on the Greek islands on 90 boats. These numbers should have been significantly higher if not for pushbacks carried out by the Hellenic Coast Guard.

Transfers to Mainland

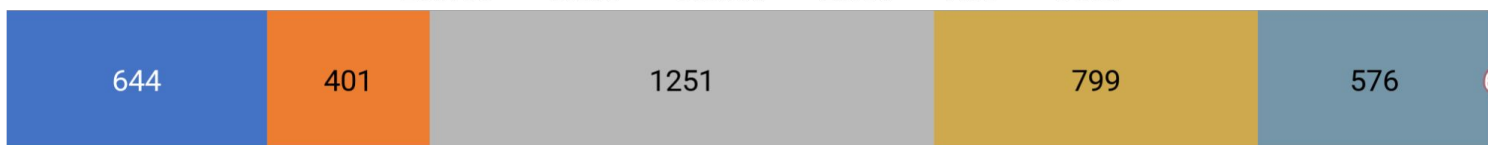


Transfers to mainland have decreased 11.8% compared to last week, official population on the islands is 3,677 people. In the last 30 days population on the islands has decreased by 817 people. This decrease is largely driven by continued transfers to the mainland.

Without sustained relocations, population levels are likely to rise again as arrivals continue. Transfers remain the only effective measure to reduce pressure on the islands.

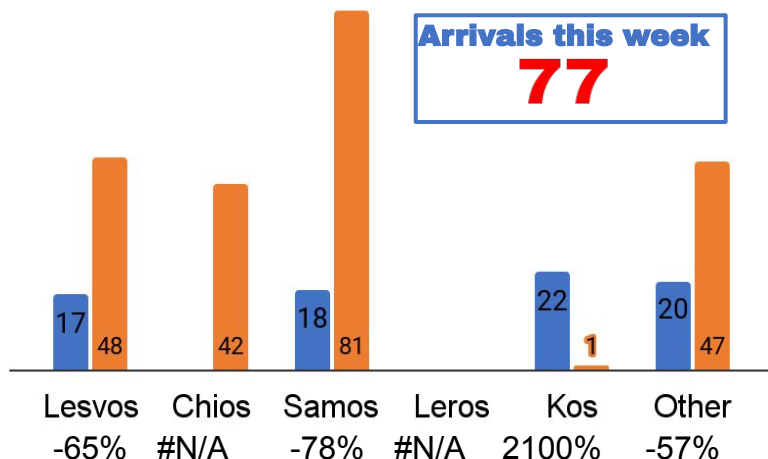
Population on the Aegean islands

■ Lesvos ■ Chios ■ Samos ■ Leros ■ Kos ■ Other



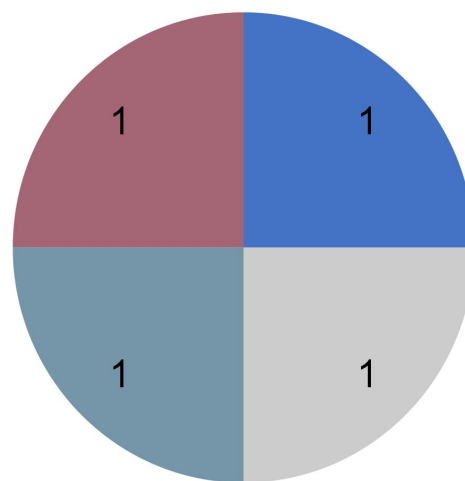
People Arrived on Aegean islands

Arrivals have decreased by 64.8% compared to last week. The number of registered boats arriving on the islands is down from 6 boats last week to 4 boats this week. The total number of boats departing has decreased from 20 boats last week to 9 boats this week.

This week, TCG/police picked up 5 boats (55.6%), while 4 boats (44.4%) reached the Greek islands. So far this year, 90 boats have arrived, while 64% have been intercepted by TCG.
